BOOK REVIEW:

<u>Understanding Wood Finishing</u>, by Bob Flexner. Rosedale Press \$27.95.

The book answers all the questions about wood finishing that you are ever likely to ask. The author describes the differences between various oil finishes since some oil finishes are oil - varnish blends, some are wiping varnishes, some penetrate and can't build up a finish while others can build a finish.

There is a chapter on the various types of stains pigments and dyes - and how they work and which to use for various types of work. Another chapter deals with film finishes - shellac, lacquers, varnish,m polyurethane and water base.

The author goes into great depth on how stains and finishes work, thus enabling the worker to make knowledgeable choices. There is a chapter describing and showing the effect of using stains and fishes on different types of wood.

The color photographs are excellent and show clearly the different effects. This book is unique. There is an orderly layout, explanations are clear and precise and the photographs clearly indicate what the author is saying. This is a book that I think every woodworker should have as reference.
