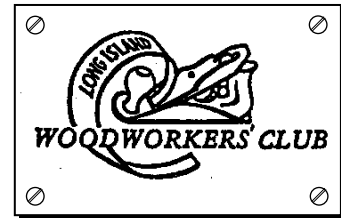

It is helpful to include a photo of the project(s), which can be submitted with the exhibit form or sent to me later via email or at the next meeting.

At this point, we are still focused on producing a successful Show at Hofstra University Arena on October 6th and 7th. If you haven't already marked your calendars or your Blackberry with the date, better do so now. The Friday before the Show (October 5th) will be the date to arrive to the Arena with your project(s) for the exhibit. As always, we are seeking as many members as possible to help out on these three dates, and your efforts will be greatly appreciated!
