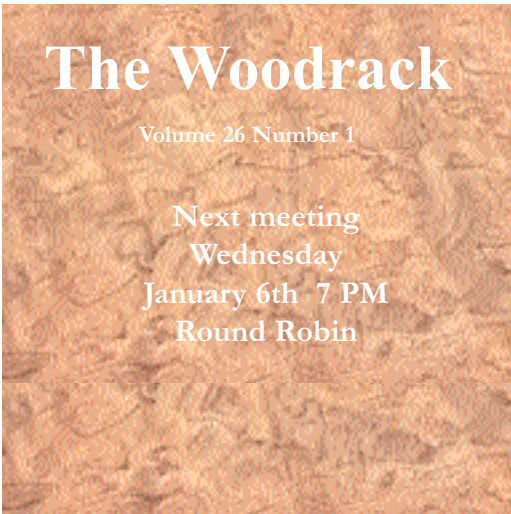

We did have some time for show and tell. Steve brought in a plane with a unique blade holding mechanism that allows you to adjust the blade without loosening it from the frog.

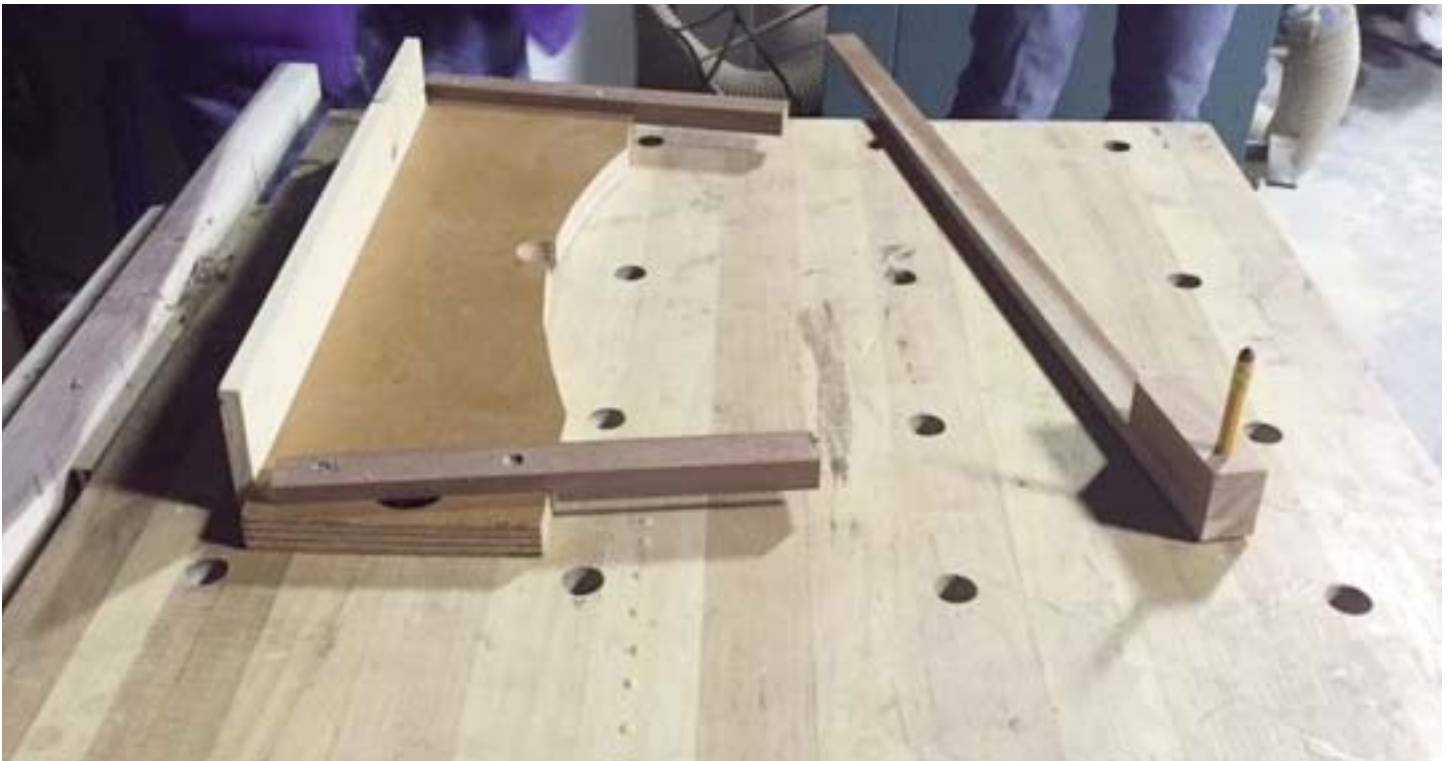
Rob made a wine rack from sapele, and is planning on making another to go with it (which I later saw a picture of).

Jim B made a jig for putting a consistent radius around the edge of cutting boards with a router, and then routing finger holds on the ends (he'll have that at the round robin)

Bob showed us a pot belly base for a pedestal table he's making. He learned the hard way that you need to make sure your project fits within the capacity of your tools! He almost couldn't run it thru his band saw. It's also important to make measurements correctly when you're gluing up a large block, so that you don't cut into the secondary wood (core) when shaping.

Our January meeting will be in the usual place, and hopefully we will have a projector setup, so feel free to bring in project pictures on your phone/tablet/USB drive/Apple IIC to show and tell.
